Dr. Felisi Sorgwe: Unmasking Prejudice (Acts 10)

Dr. Felisi Sorgwe, is associate professor of theology at <u>Houston Baptist University</u> and pastor of <u>Maranatha International Church</u> in Houston. Sorgwe speaks directly to the relationship between prejudice and justice. Prejudice creates a "line of demarcation" for the distribution of justice between "us and them."

Acts 10 records the story of Peter's prejudice against people like Cornelius. Cornelius had a different problem that wouldn't be helped by Peter's prejudice. Acts 10 tells how God intervened to unwrap a long tradition of prejudice.
