## **Pastor Eric Tarver: The Kind of Church God Uses (Revelation 3:10-13)**

Eric Tarver, the pastor of <u>Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church</u> in Beeville and director of church relations at Stark College and Seminary in Corpus Christi, opened by illustrating how some churches are like recalled medications. Just as a pharmaceutical company will recall an ineffective—or even harmful—medication, a church may be recalled from its ministry.

Tarver urged his congregation to make the most of the door Jesus has opened for the church, not shying away from the trials and troubles of persecution that accompany following Jesus. Some "want the title without the testimony," he said. He ends with a charge to persevere.
