The East Texas Baptist University Bass Fishing team served recently in Brazil as part of the Tiger Athletic Mission Experience program. ETBU partnered with Amazon Outreach, an organization that works directly with Brazilian missionaries to spread the gospel to the people in the Amazon River region. The team ministered in nine villages, helping with medical and dental clinics, leading Vacation Bible Schools and distributing eyeglasses. In Santa Maria, the team transported equipment and built a water well, as well as assisting with a construction project. **Cameron Burger** is head coach of the ETBU bass fishing team.
