


Around the State: Bush speaks at DBU, ETBU hosts Congreso event

Dallas Baptist University held its 27th annual Patriots baseball banquet Feb. 8. **Devlin Granberg**, former member of the DBU Patriots baseball team and now part of the Boston Red Sox organization, was honored at the banquet. He was named the Society for American Baseball Research Metroplex Player of the Year after leading the nation in hits and setting single-season school records in batting average, hits, on-base percentage and stolen bases. About 1,500 people filled the Patty and Bo Pilgrim Chapel for a related event featuring former President **George W. Bush**. **Pete Delkus**, chief meteorologist at WFAA-TV and member of the DBU board of trustees, moderated a question-and-answer time with Bush, who discussed faith, family, service, leadership and baseball. Bush spoke about leadership lessons gleaned from a life of service, emphasizing the importance of maintaining priorities and possessing guiding principles that never waver, whether in victory or defeat. **Dan Heefner**, head coach of the DBU Patriots baseball team, also spoke.
