

Lawmakers seek repeal of no-aid-to-religion provision in Oklahoma constitution

OKLAHOMA CITY (BNG)—Lawmakers in Oklahoma are pushing a ballot initiative to repeal a section of the state constitution that prohibits the use of taxpayer money or property to advance religion. Oklahoma’s “no-aid” provision is one of several state laws barring the use of public funds for religious purposes being debated in modern-day skirmishes over the separation of church and state.
