
## UT Dallas: Celebrating an addition to God's family

and celebrate with her brothers and sisters in Christ.

Over spring break, she had the opportunity to go on a medical mission trip and share the gospel with people in El Paso. The redemption found in Jesus has transformed her heart and has spurred her on to action. Ana has been eager to pursue obedience to God, and it has been my joy to walk alongside her.
